The Hutchinson River, located in New York State, is a fresh water stream whose source is located in Scarsdale and then flows south for five miles through lower Westchester County and part of the Brenx, where it empties into Eastchester Bay. According to the Army Corps of Engineers, it has its menth at the southern tip of City Island.

The river is highly polluted - the water quality degraded. For a considerable time, this condition has prevailed. As far back as the late 19th century, residents from Pelham and Pelham Manor (two villages the river passes through) submitted formal complaints to the State Board of Health, Albany, NY, protesting the emptying of sewerage into the river. They urged the Board to take immediate action to prohibit this practice. People worldwide have thought nothing of discarding their waste into the nearest body of water. It is not surprising that in 1999 the Department of Environmental Conservation listed the Hutchinson River as belonging to the most polluted category that the state employs.


Members of the Hutchinson River Restoration Project (HRRP) visited several river sites and saw sections choked with trash and the river strewn with discarded household articles. As a consequence of this enormous neglect, the river has been abandoned by humans and wildlife. We would like to bring them back.

HRRP has attended many Bronx events and has spoken to many individuals involved in reclaiming and protecting rivers. HRRP has become a strong advocate for the river.

The key to change is education. With this in mind, we have established goals that will reflect our mission, which is to clean up the river and restore its greenways.
